GRACE TO YOU AND PEACE FROM GOD OUR FATHER AND THE LORD JESUS CHRIST,

I hope that this newsletter finds you and your family doing well. Wow. Where to begin? 2020 was quite the year to say the least. But more on that in just a bit...

Let me begin by giving you an update on the ministry. The year started off like most others. In January and February I traveled and preached. I attended the G3 Conference in Atlanta and got to have wonderful fellowship with so many like-minded believers from all over the country and around the world. I had the opportunity to preach at The Master's Seminary chapel service which is always a special privilege.

I was scheduled to teach a class for academic credit at the Baptist Missionary Alliance Theological Seminary in Jacksonville, TX in the spring but then...COVID. Just as I was preparing to depart, colleges, universities and seminaries began to close and everything moved online. I still taught the class via Skype. I assigned research papers and gave the students an exam. Though teaching a class strictly through Zoom was an odd dynamic, by God's grace the students did seem to learn much and benefit from it. By the end of the two-week course, all of my preaching engagements had to be canceled.

As an evangelist, having all of one's preaching engagements canceled might seem like the worst thing possible, but it really was not. The main upshot is that it gave me several months at home with my wife, Kathy. Kathy liked having me home and, well, Mia, our 5 year-old, ten pound, 4-legged little furry bundle of joy seemed to as well. Though I was not traveling to preach, I was asked to do many interviews via Skype or Zoom. I was also asked to preach on a number of Sunday mornings for churches around the world. Due to the time differences, I would preach Saturday night for churches on Sunday morning in places like India, Malaysia, the Philippines, South Africa and Australia. Preaching expositional sermons while looking into a pinhole camera on my computer is a very different (and quite odd) dynamic but I am so grateful that we have that kind of technology. This is the first year in many that I have not traveled internationally (scheduled trips to Israel, Brazil, Guatemala and Madagascar had to be canceled) but I was still able to preach to brothers and sisters all over the world and, by God's grace, they seem to have been encouraged and edified by it.

Beginning in November of 2020 I had the privilege of teaching a class on Monday nights at a small church in Billings, Montana entitled Fundamentals Of The Faith; a curriculum from Grace To You. As of this writing, I am still teaching it. There are not many in attendance but those who are coming seem to be learning and, at times, challenged – but that is a good thing for all of us. As Christians we are commanded “not to abandon our own meeting together” (Hebrews 10:25). It is only through a local body of believers and the instruction, accountability and fellowship provided therein that we can grow in Christ.

In early 2020, I met a man named Bobby McDonald who has done many years of missionary work in Russia. The Word-Faith movement is quickly growing there and he was desperate to get my DVD, Clouds Without Water (henceforth CWW) translated into Russian and put into book form. So, in the months I was grounded from traveling, I wrote a book on the Word-Faith movement and kept the same title. The book is a short one (about 100 pages) so as to get as many printed and disseminated throughout Russia as possible. Bobby said that his goal is to get 5-10 copies in each of the 6,800 Baptist churches in Russia. Thus far about 4000 have already gone out and another 4000 are now being printed.



CWW is also being translated into Chinese. The plan is to first get it out on various social media platforms and then try to get physical copies. Due to the restrictions of the communist government on religious freedom, disseminating physical books containing the Gospel is challenging. Social media provides more venues to get the message into the hands of China's people. You may have heard that Christianity is exploding in China but, tragically, the “Christianity” that is growing there is Word-Faith and the Prosperity gospel – which is no Gospel at all. Please pray that God uses this resource to equip believers in communist China to refute heresy and be more

grounded in Truth. And, as if that were not encouraging enough, HeartCry Missionary Society, led by Paul Washer, is translating CWW into Spanish. I am encouraged by and grateful for God's kind providences in bringing all of this together. May He receive the glory due to Him alone.

Another happy ministerial development came via a letter from the David L. Moss Criminal Justice Center in Tulsa, Oklahoma. Jimmy, an inmate there, was genuinely converted in prison. Shortly after his conversion, he began listening to and reading solid Bible teachers like John MacArthur and Steve Lawson. He also began watching some of my teaching including but not limited to CWW. By God's grace, the truth presented made a huge impact on him.

Prisons are by no means devoid of religious activity – far from it. “Jailhouse conversions” are quite common. The problem, though, is that the great majority of “Christian” teaching in our prison system is Word-Faith and prosperity gospel theology. I have had the opportunity to present my seminar in two prisons, one in Washington and one in Texas. About two days after I left the one in Texas, the chaplain called me and said, “Justin, the day after you left, the garbage cans in the unit were absolutely full of Kenneth Copeland, Jesse Duplantis and Joyce Meyer books and magazines.” That was what the inmates had been ingesting. After they saw the truth, they got rid of it.



Jimmy and I have had several phone conversations (the prison limits them to about 8 minutes) and he has told me that he is leading a group of inmates through my entire CWW teaching. He said the men are absolutely eating it up and are greatly benefiting. Jimmy is so encouraged by the response and growth he is seeing in the men that he has asked me to create an official-looking certificate to present to them upon their completion of the course. This put the biggest grin on my face, and I will definitely be sending those certificates out. The good thing about going through the CWW material is that these inmates will not only be equipped to refute the error of Word-Faith theology, but also learn how to rightly interpret scripture and will hear the true Gospel presented throughout. May God

bless Jimmy's good work there.

2020: A BAD YEAR TO BE A PROPHET

To borrow from a movie title from a few years back (which I did not see), 2020 has been the “Terrible, Horrible, No Good, Very Bad Year” for the charismatic prophets. It is really not even possible to adequately put into words just how much this past year has exposed the charismatic movement as the complete farce that it is.

It all began in January of 2020 when Sid Roth, host of the program It's Supernatural, had 20 of the top voices in the prophetic movement come onto his show and share what God had shown them would transpire throughout the year. These voices included names such as Perry Stone, Cindy Jacob, Jeremiah Johnson, Patricia King, and Tracy Cooke among others. All of them gave very positive, uplifting prophecies about 2020 but were also, as is typical, very vague. Vagueness is the friend of the false prophets for it makes their prophecies more difficult to disprove.

Guess what none of these prophets prophesied? Guess what none of these “seers” (a title they often use for themselves) saw coming? That's right...COVID-19. None of them. Not one.

COVID has been one of the most earth-shattering, globally-impacting events in any of our lifetimes. COVID is clearly more dangerous for some than others, but what is beyond debate is that its repercussions have impacted almost everyone on the planet to one degree or another. If we haven't personally been infected, likely all of us know someone who has. Untold numbers of small businesses have been shut down and many will never reopen. Millions upon millions have lost their jobs. The political realm has been in upheaval...and none of the “seers” saw this coming? In fact, one of these “prophets,” James Goll, comically prophesied that (and I quote) “stadiums would be filled, beginning in 2020 and beyond.” We've all seen the empty sports stadiums this year, filled only by the cardboard cutouts of people to provide some semblance of normalcy.

Another false prophet, Shawn Bolz, based out of the heretical Bethel Church (which, incidentally, produces Bethel Music) prophesied in February that “the tide is turning” on the virus and “it's not going to become the pandemic people are afraid of.” This was reported on Fox News' website. Well, the tide was obviously not turning, and it did become a pandemic. Rather than learn from his embarrassing, nationally promoted false prophecy, Bolz, along with Bethel pastors Bill Johnson and Kris Vallotton, joined Che Ahn, and Brazilian pastor Ed Silvano on March 20th for a Facebook live event during which they proceeded to decree an end to COVID. They banished it from the face of the earth, except they didn't.

Of all the false prophets, though, none beclowned himself as much as Kenneth Copeland. On March 29th, Copeland had had

For from Him and through Him and

enough of COVID and forcefully and angrily started speaking to it. With closed eyes and a grimaced face, Copeland growled, "In the name of Jesus, standing in the office of the prophet of God, I execute judgment on you COVID-19! ...I demand judgment on you! I demand a vaccine to come immediately!" One must wonder why a vaccine would even be necessary after judgment on the virus had already been executed – but these folks are not exactly known for logical consistency. Copeland said, "It is finished! It is over!" Then, looking at his watch, the billionaire false prophet said, "At exactly 12 noon, on the 29th day of March...it's over." Of course, COVID at that time was just getting ramped up. On March 29th, the day Copeland killed COVID, there were 144,321 confirmed cases in the United States. As I write this, there are over 22 million reported cases. Aside from legitimate debate as to the accuracy of the official numbers, there is no doubt that the cases have grown exponentially since Copeland "killed" and "executed judgment" on the disease.

The old adage, 'If you're in a hole, quit digging,' is not in the false prophet playbook. Just a few days later, on April 2nd, Copeland said, "I heard the Lord say this to me several weeks ago: 'Kenneth, you believe Me for a heatwave.' I walked out into my backyard and I did the very same thing I do against those storms and tornadoes, and I spoke it in the name of Jesus: (yelling) I call for a strong south wind! ...I call for a supernatural heat wave all over this nation and anywhere else in the world it is needed! I speak to this atmosphere! Burn!" (All of this can be seen in the video entitled "The Modern Prophets And Faith Healers Utterly Destroyed By COVID-19" on my YouTube channel). You see, the working theory at the time was that COVID would be greatly weakened with summer's coming hot weather. Some speculated it might just die out altogether. So Copeland commanded a heatwave to blanket the earth.

In just a couple of clicks I was at weather.com and I looked up the numbers to see if indeed a "supernatural 4 heatwave" was about to commence in Newark, TX, where Copeland's ministry is based and the provenance of his meteorological declaration. The following day, April 3rd, the high temperature in Newark was 42°F. The average high for Newark on that day of the year is 73°F. Not only was there not a "supernatural heat wave," the high temperature the very next day was a full 31° below normal! Copeland is as inept meteorologically as he is prophetically. Then just a few minutes later, in a display that would make every quasi germaphobe retreat to his happy place and curl up in the fetal position, Copeland blew – literally blew – COVID-19 into the abyss. This spectacle has become fodder for many spoof videos, some of which have garnered millions of views, on social media.



The other major 2020 event that none of the prophets saw coming were the riots. In the wake of George Floyd's death, Black Lives Matter and Antifa rioters attacked people, attacked police, invaded buildings, smashed and burned small businesses, looted and vandalized dozens upon dozens of cities all across the country each and every night for months. The United States has seen localized riots before, but nothing on this scale. Cities were on fire. The riots have been one of if not the most prolonged periods of civil unrest in the history of the United States. How did the prophets not see that coming? The societal, political and economic repercussions from the upheaval continue to reverberate today and yet not one of the "seers" saw any of it coming.

The other major event of 2020 that everyone knew was coming was the United States Presidential election. All of the prophets weighed in on this one. Sid Roth had prophet after prophet after prophet on his show all throughout 2020 to share with everyone what the Alpha and Omega was telling them about who would occupy the White House come January 20, 2021. Every single one of them confidently prophesied that Donald Trump would win re-election.

I am writing this on January 9th, 2020. Aside from all of the legitimate concerns about voting fraud and irregularities, Donald Trump is not going to occupy the Oval Office come January 21, 2020. Joe Biden will. I didn't vote for him. Joe Biden's social policies are the antithesis of a biblical worldview. Among a host of other concerns, he favors the unrestricted access to the murder of unborn children. But he will be the next President of the United States and I will pray for him as I have prayed for Mr. Trump in accord with 1 Timothy 2:2.

The point of the matter is this: If these "prophets" are really hearing from God outside of scripture as they claim, how is it that literally 100% of them misheard God on something as monumental as the United States presidential election? There were literally dozens of these self-appointed prophets including Kenneth Copeland, Paula White, Pat Robertson, Mark Taylor, Jonathan Cahn, Jim Bakker, Sid Roth, Kris Vallotton, Shawn Bolz, Stephen Strang (Editor of Charisma Media) Patricia King, Lance Wallnau, etc., etc., etc. and they all missed it. And it's not like the election snuck up on them and took them by surprise. Ever since Trump took office in 2016, we all knew he was going to run for reelection. So, think about this: Dozens and dozens of "prophets" literally had a minimum of 4 years to make sure they were hearing God rightly on an event as scheduled and globally consequential as this and yet they missed it – and they even had a 50/50 chance of getting it right on their own! Lest you be tempted to say, 'Well, Trump really did win the election. He only lost because there was so much fraud,' it is not that they prophesied only that Trump would win, but specifically that he would serve a second term. If these "prophets" cannot even get a presidential election right with years to prepare, on what grounds could they ever be believed for any other "prophetic word" on anything else? They can't.

In a "worship" service held a few days after Biden had been declared the winner, Kenneth Copeland went into a maniacal laughing

spell mocking that reality. He was adamant that Trump would eventually be declared the victor. Even after the electors were certified on January 6th, 2021, and Trump in a national address said that “a new administration will be inaugurated on January 20th” some of them STILL maintained that Trump would be sworn in for a second term. Even after there was a riot and breach of the United States Capitol building, Kat Kerr, Hank Kunneman, and Dutch Sheets incredibly stood by their prophecies. Speaking of riots, that is yet another monumental event missed by the prophets. In fact, at the very moment the protesters were storming the Capitol building, Kat Kerr was being interviewed live on YouTube. In blissful ignorance of what was transpiring in Washington D.C.



simultaneously as she was being interviewed, Kerr claimed that God had not merely given her a vision of Trump being inaugurated but that He actually took her into the future – as in Michael J. Fox “Back To The Future” time travel - and showed her the inauguration. One can only wonder how in all of her divine revelations, visions, and even time travel this “seer” somehow missed seeing the riot. And, for that matter, how did she miss seeing the guy with the buffalo headdress standing behind the Speaker’s desk in the United State’s Senate chamber? That’s not something you see everyday. Surely that would have been worth a stop on God’s guided tour into the future.

The last 12 months have arguably seen the highest concentration of globally impactful events in our lifetimes and yet none of these prophets got a single thing right. Not. One. They were spectacularly and - were these issues not so serious - comically wrong. There is more prophetic power in a Zoltar machine or a Magic 8 Ball than in all of these “prophets” put together. Miss Cleo from The Psychic Network was more of a seer than any of the charismatic seers. Rafiki the baboon from The Lion King could run prophetic circles around everyone in the charismatic/prophetic movement.



I speak in these stark terms because these issues are so incredibly serious. It is not just that these Word-Faith and charismatic charlatans have utterly beclowned themselves (which they most certainly have), but that they have made a mockery out of Christians and Christianity. There are a number of atheistic channels on YouTube that have taken dozens of these clips and are using them as a means of derision against Christians and Christianity in general. Tragically, what much of the world believes about Christianity is what it sees on Christian television. Because of Trump’s close relationship with the likes of Kenneth Copeland and Paula White, these charlatans have had a far larger audience than they did before, and the world is laughing at them. A true prophet, Ezekiel, gave a true word from the Lord:

“Woe to the foolish prophets who are following their own spirits and have seen nothing! ... They see deceit and lying divination, those who are saying, ‘Yahweh declares,’ when Yahweh has not sent them. ... So My hand will be against the prophets who see false visions and utter lying divinations. They will have no place in the council of My people.”

Ezekiel 13:3, 6, 9

God holds His name and His word above all things (Psalm 138:2). It is a very serious matter to put words in God’s mouth He did not say. So serious, in fact, that God prescribes the death penalty for those who do so (Deuteronomy 18:20). Thankfully, for today’s modern false prophets, we are no longer living in the Old Testament theocracy and so the death penalty is no longer enacted on them. But the criterion as to what makes one a false prophet remains unchanged as does God’s anger toward them. False prophets bring untold reproach upon God’s name, His Word and His Gospel.

Given the irrefutable failure of every single charismatic prophet and the just the overall negative tenor and feel of 2020, a number of people have speculated to me that this might be the beginning of the end of the charismatic movement. “How can the prosperity gospel and prophets possibly survive such a year?” many have wondered. I wish that that were so. I would love to see all of this theological deception come to a deserving end, but it will not. 2020 will be but a bump in the charismatic road. I do not even believe it will be a long-lasting bump. God makes a fascinating statement in Jeremiah 3:30-31:

“An appalling and horrible thing has happened in the land: The prophets prophesy falsely, and the priests rule on their own authority; and My people love it this way!”

You see, the charismatic movement will not be seriously damaged because many people who profess (“profess” being the operative word) to be Christians actually love to be told lies. They love it when they are given false prophecies. They love it when they are told not the objective truth of God’s written word, but rather the subjective ramblings of a vain imagination. The Apostle Paul said that the time will come when people will “not tolerate sound doctrine” but wanting to have their ears tickled “will accumulate for themselves teachers in accordance with their own desires” (2 Timothy 4:3-4). False prophets are in and of themselves part of God’s judgment on people. Though this is undeniably true, we are still commanded to mark them (Romans 16:17) and refute them (Titus 1:9).

2020: THEOLOGICAL REFLECTIONS

I think there is much for us as Christians to learn from this year; not so much that we did not already know these things intellectually, but rather this past year has given us some experiential lessons in them.

forever. Amen. - Romans 11:36

One is that our house must be built upon the rock of Christ and not the shifting sands of culture, the economy, or politics. Things certainly did change quickly in 2020, did they not? At the beginning of the year, the economy was arguably the strongest it had ever been. Unemployment for practically every demographic group was at record lows. The stock market was soaring. President Trump seemed to be on cruise control for re-election. Then...COVID. Everything changed almost overnight. Millions lost their jobs. The economy tanked. Unemployment rivaled that of the Great Depression. For weeks we couldn't even buy toilet paper! Life as we knew it was turned upside down practically overnight.

David wrote in Psalm 20:7, "Some trust in chariots and some in horses, but we will praise the name of Yahweh our God." For those of us living in the United States, it is a constant temptation to trust in our economic and military might. But we all saw how a tiny, microscopic virus can wreck the economy and is impervious to all of the bombers, fighter jets and cruise missiles of the world's most powerful military. There is the constant temptation to trust in our system of government or the fairness of our elections, but these things, too, were shown to be quite uncertain. We can and should be thankful for the freedoms that we have – I certainly am - but we cannot put our trust in them. Our trust must be grounded in Christ and His unchanging Word. The United States of America will not last forever. It apparently does not play into the eschatological events described in Revelation, so something must happen to this country between now and then. We can be grateful for the United States (or whatever country in which we reside), but we must not put our trust therein. Our trust should have but one object: Christ.

This leads me to the sovereignty of God. My wife, Kathy, and I have often discussed how these times must be so disconcerting to those who do not possess a right understanding of God's sovereignty. As current events unfold, it would certainly seem like things are spinning out of control. Institutions that once seemed unshakable now seem quite fragile. The Democratic party, diametrically opposed to a biblical worldview, will be by the time you read this, in control of all 3 branches of the United States government. The tech giants are attempting to squelch our cherished first amendment right of free speech. In many respects, things appear to be coming apart at the seams.

But they aren't. God is in control. God raises up one king and puts down another (Psalm 75:7) and every king's heart "is like channels of water in the hand of Yahweh; He turns it wherever He pleases" (Proverbs 21:1). Every governing authority that exists is established by God (Romans 13:1). God does whatever He pleases in the Heavens and in the earth (Psalm 135:6) and He "upholds all things by the word of his power" (Hebrews 1:3). That means that every atom in all of the universe is being held right now in its proper place by the constant exertion of the power of God. A single atom of helium in the core of some unknown star in some far-flung galaxy that has never been seen by human eye is being held in its place right now by God. What an incredible thought!

And what a comforting thought. As Charles Spurgeon once said, "The sovereignty of God is the pillow upon which the child of God rests his head at night, giving perfect peace." Selah. What we are seeing in this world is not God losing control, but rather God working out all things that He has decreed from the end to the beginning and accomplishing all of His good pleasure (Isaiah 46:10).

2020 also gave churches the opportunity to live out the scriptural command to assemble together for worship (Hebrews 10:25). In the Spring, most states banned the assembling of groups of people. Most churches closed their doors and had online services only. But as it became apparent that the virus was not lethal to the vast majority of people, some churches began to reopen. Many states, though, continued to forbid churches from gathering while at the same time placing no such restrictions on casinos or tens of thousands of protesters. John MacArthur, pastor of Grace Community Church, opened the church in defiance of the orders from Los Angeles Mayor Garcetti and California Governor Gavin Newsom.



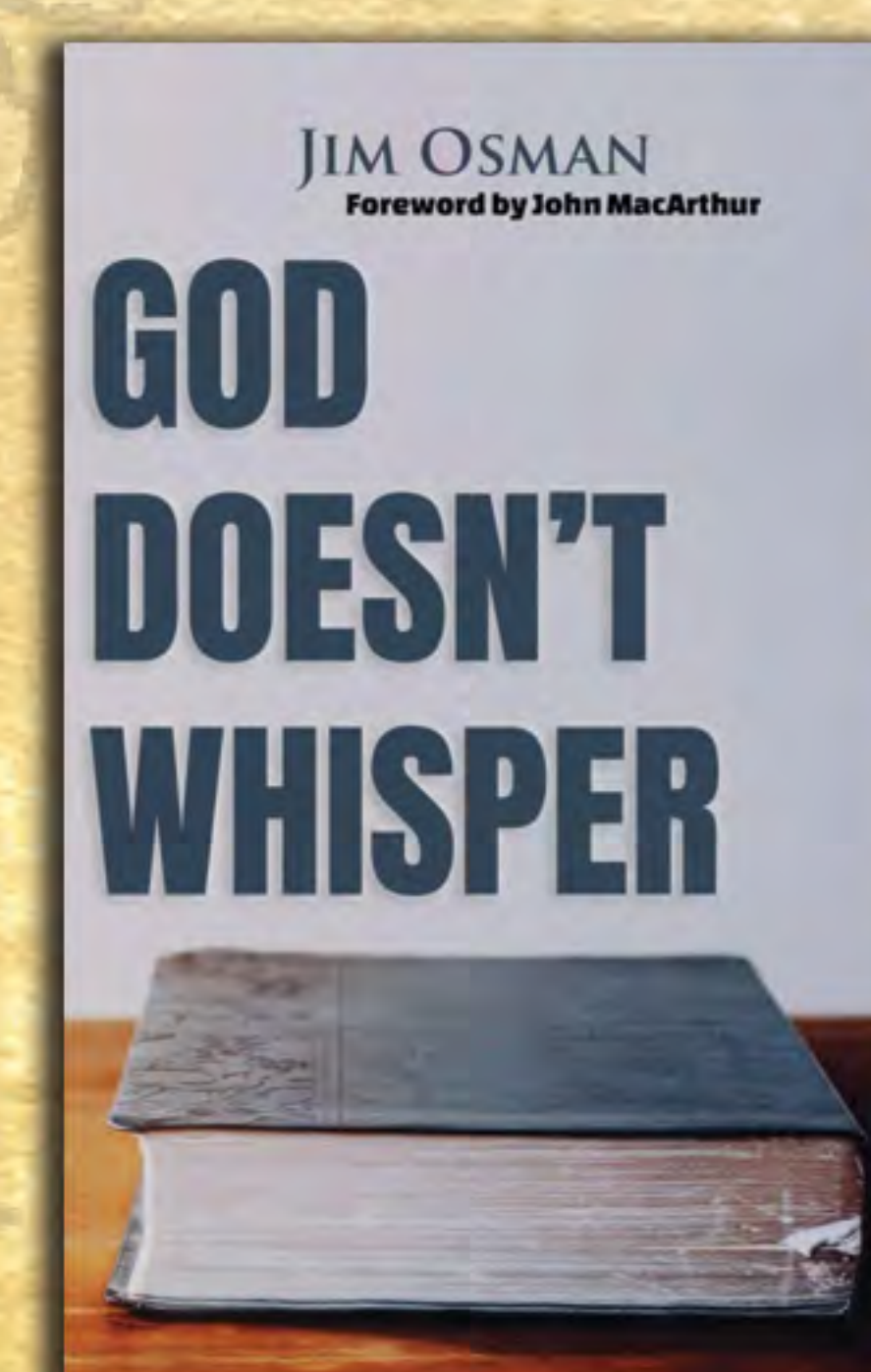
MacArthur rightly understood that gathering for worship is essential for the Christian. It is a command and it is the yearning of the regenerate heart to gather with fellow believers and worship Christ. Though the Bible calls us to obey the governing authorities (Romans 13), it also instructs the believer to obey God rather than man when the rules of the former contradicts the commands of the latter (Acts 5). Despite the threat of government action against the church, MacArthur and his fellow elders stood firm and kept the doors of Grace Community open. God chose to honor this obedience with worldwide attention. MacArthur was interviewed by numerous national media outlets and millions of people who had never before heard of him

were introduced to his preaching and teaching. This is not, of course, to say that there were not thousands of other faithful pastors doing the same thing as he, because there indeed were, but his very public stand was a great testimony to a watching world.

LOOKING AHEAD TO 2021

James 4:13-15 gives us a strong admonition not to presume upon God as it relates to making plans, and so in keeping with this, I would like to share with you the ministry plans for 2021 if the Lord wills.

The National Religious Broadcasters (NRB) is supposed to air CWW on its network this year. They are also going to air a series of programs Jim Osman and I recorded on his book entitled Truth or Territory: A Biblical Approach To Spiritual Warfare. This will expose many, many more people to these needed teachings. In March, Jim Osman and I will be recording a series on how God does and does not speak to us today. Jim has recently written a book entitled God Doesn't Whisper that is a tour-de-force for the sufficiency of scripture. If you have ever wondered about the "still small voice" or "My sheep hear My voice" and if there is something wrong with you

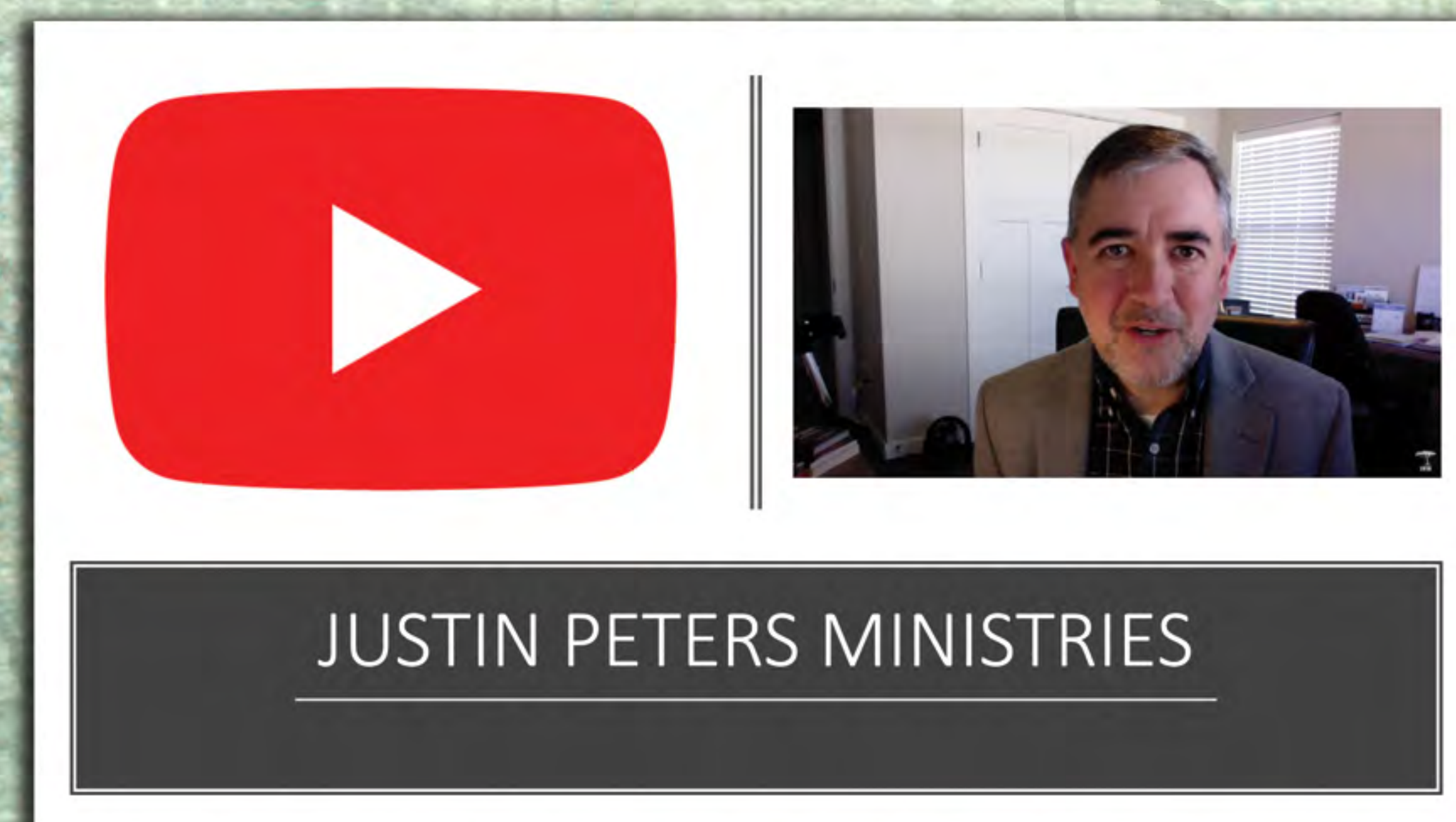


because you have not heard God's voice, then please do yourself a favor and get a copy of this book. I cannot commend it to you enough.

My book, CWW, in both printed and electronic form will be distributed throughout Russia, China and the Spanish speaking world. I am really, really excited about this project and am so very grateful for the hard work that many brothers and sisters in Christ are putting into it. As bad as Word-Faith is here in the United States, it is far worse in other parts of the world. May God use this resource to bring many out of this deception.

Beginning in February, I have a pretty robust preaching schedule. I will be all over the United States and, Lord willing, will be preaching in Brazil, Madagascar, and Guatemala. Some people, I think, assume that CWW is all I ever preach about, but that is not the case. To be sure, I am frequently asked to present CWW, but I am also frequently doing exposition and dealing with other subject matters. Additionally, we are planning a guided trip to Israel from October 24th to November 5th of 2021. I, along with my friends Andrew Rappaport and Anthony Silvestro, will be leading this trip and will visit many of the places about which we read in the scriptures. I have been to Israel once before and it truly is life-impacting. If you would like more information, please visit www.israeltour2021.com

I will also continue my podcast, Didache, as well as develop my YouTube channel. My YouTube channel has grown from about 10k subscribers to over 82k as of this writing and nearly 5 million views. I am receiving very, very encouraging feedback from people all over the world who watch it. According to the statistics, people in 80+ countries are watching - and I barely even know what I'm doing! I have none of the fancy graphics or special effects or a professional studio that many YouTubers have. I don't even ask people to subscribe, it just happens. As John MacArthur has said, we are responsible for the depth of our ministries, God is responsible for the breadth.



As you might imagine, I receive some very vitriolic comments from some, but the vast majority of the feedback I receive is so very encouraging. I would like to share a portion of a handwritten note I recently received:
