## YEAR IN REVIEW 2019

### DOMESTIC

This year I preached in 11 different states: California, Montana, Colorado, New Mexico, Texas, Michigan, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Alabama, Oklahoma, and Massachusetts; some multiple times. On each trip I always meet wonderful brothers and sisters in Christ who bless and encourage me in so many different ways.

Early in the year Kathy accompanied me to Grace Church in Greely, CO, pastored by Travis Allen. While there we stayed with Jack and Jamie Pearson and their adult daughter, Jaquelyn. Jaquelyn was in a very serious car accident as a teenager and was left confined to a wheelchair and unable to speak. She will always be dependent upon others for her care. Kathy and Jamie just hit it off immediately. Jamie was saved out of some hyper-charismatic theology and, though definitely on the right track, still had quite a bit of theological de-programming to do. Kathy spent a lot of time with Jamie helping her to better understand the biblical theology of human suffering and God's sovereignty. Though we have not seen them in nearly a year, Kathy talks with Jamie regularly and sends her daily devotionals. Jamie has been soaking up truth like a sponge. The Lord has used Kathy powerfully in Jamie's life. It was a kind providence of God to cross their paths.

Twice this year I had the opportunity to do some video recording at Living Waters, a wonderful evangelistic and apologetic ministry led by Ray Comfort. I was interviewed by my friend and employee of Living Waters, Mark Spence, for an online training platform they are calling "Living Waters Equip." Mark asked me 50 or so questions on various theological issues for which I gave 2-4 minute answers. They have interviewed a number of other speakers for this project as well and, once completed, I think will be an excellent apologetic resource.

The Apostle Paul states in Romans 9:3 that he would be willing to be accursed from Christ if his own kinsmen could be saved. Mark Spence has known Ray for over 30 years and told me, *"Justin, I always thought Paul was being hyperbolic when he said that - until I met Ray Comfort. Ray Comfort is that man. Ray would literally give up his own salvation for someone else to know Christ."* Ray Comfort, my friends, is the real deal.

In October I preached at Highland Park in Woodland, Colorado, just outside of Colorado Springs. Highland Park pastored by a wonderful man named Jeff Gwinn. Jeff and I had great fellowship together. There is a massive Word-Faith "church" (I put this term in quotation marks because it is not a true church by biblical standards) led by a man named Andrew Wommack. Wommack has his own television program on TBN, Daystar and God TV.

He founded and heads Charis Bible College that, unfortunately, trains men and women how to wrongly interpret scripture and preach Word-Faith/Prosperity gospel theology. One day Jeff and I dropped by Charis just to check out the facility and, hopefully, talk to a few of the students.

Wow! Was that place ever massive – and ornate! It truly boggles the mind how much money flows into these large Word-Faith “ministries.” I talked to a number of students and invited them to come to the seminar at Highland Park (none did). I even went to their bookstore and inquired of the lady working there if she had ever heard of the DVD entitled *Clouds Without Water* (she hadn't). I suggested to her it would be a good DVD to carry in their bookstore. She was Googling it as I rolled out on my scooter. What I will most remember about the trip, though, was talking to a young man named Tom.

I saw Tom sitting in a chair facing one of the massive windows in the facility and noticed he was reading his Bible. I motored over to him and introduced myself. I asked him what he was reading and he replied, “1 Kings.” I inquired if he was a student at Charis. He said he has applied and would begin classes in Spring of 2020. I then asked him, “Tom, do you believe that it is always God's will for us to be physically healed?” Given his theology, he of course said, “Yes.” I then asked if he would turn to Exodus 4:11 in his Bible and read it for me. He did and read

*“The Lord said to him (Moses), “Who has made man's mouth? Or who makes him mute or deaf, or seeing or blind? Is it not I, Yahweh?”*

I said, “Tom, what do you make of that? That is God speaking and He directly says He makes some men mute and blind.” Clearly rattled from what he just read, after a long pause, Tom finally said, “That's the Old Testament. God doesn't do that today. Everyone was healed in the New Testament.” For time sake I did not challenge his faulty theology and reasoning on that point, so I said, “Ok, well, let's look at another passage. Can you read Galatians 4:13-14 for me?” He reluctantly turned there.

*“But you know that it was because of a bodily illness that I came and preached the gospel to you the first time; and that which was a trial to you in my bodily condition you did not despise or loathe...”*

He just stared at it silently. He would not read it aloud, so I did. I said, “Tom, this is the Apostle Paul writing. He clearly states he had a bodily illness. He was sick. What do you do with that?” Tom sat there and said nothing. He just stared at the text, never breaking eye contact with it. After another long pause, I said, “Tom, the Apostle Paul says he was sick.” Tom looked up at me and said, “That's what *you* say.” A bit surprised, I replied, “No, Tom, that is not what I say, that is what the Bible says.” “No, that's what *you* say!” replied Tom.

Tom literally would not admit that what he was reading was actually in the Bible – *and it was his own Bible!* I could hardly believe what I was seeing. This was a tragic illustration of a solemn truth, though. It truly does take the work of the Holy Spirit to open people's eyes to the spiritual deception they are in. People often ask me how they can reason with their friends or family members to get them to come out of various false beliefs. Often the ones asking me were themselves saved out of the very deception that entraps their loved ones. I tell them that the only thing they can do is lovingly show them the truth from God's word and pray that He would open their eyes. There is an inherent power in God's Word that is found nowhere else (read the ending of Luke 16:19-31 for a vivid illustration). If a person will not respond to scripture, then there is simply no other card to play. I shared the Gospel with Tom, told him that I hope the truth I showed him will haunt him and that he would not enroll at Charis. May God open Tom's eyes.

On a happier note, Kathy accompanied me to First Baptist Church in Weymouth, MA, where we met John and Deb Kespert. I first became aware of Deb through her website and blog [www.headstickdeb.com](http://www.headstickdeb.com). Deb refers to herself as “Headstick Deb” because she types with a stick that is attached to her head via a harness. You see, Deb was born with cerebral palsy (CP). CP has a wide range of severity levels. Some cases of CP are so mild as to not even be noticeable. Others, though, are very severe. Deb's is the latter. Her legs and arms are very thin and drawn up. She cannot use them at all. She spends her days in an electric wheelchair that she controls with her chin. Her speech is also very affected. Sometimes John has to translate for her.

Speaking of John, he too, is disabled. John contracted polio as a boy (he is now 70) and is also confined to a wheelchair. Though he has control of his arms and can speak normally, his breathing is severely limited. He must give himself a nebulizer every few minutes to keep his airways open.

John and Deb deeply love one another. That is so obvious just being around them for a few minutes. Not only do they love one another, but they are deeply devoted to and love Christ. They are faithful students of God's word and are faithful members of FBC (they are picked up on Sundays by a public, wheelchair accessible van). They both teach sound doctrine and refute those who contradict per Titus 1:9. Kathy and I were privileged to spend some time with them while in Weymouth.

What an encouragement they were to us – as well as a living rebuke to the times we are tempted to take things for granted. Ladies, I would commend Deb's online ministry to you. And also, ladies (and men for your wives), John is an Avon salesman. He humorously told me that people used to ask Deb, "Does he still...ah...struggle?" thinking that he must be an ex-homosexual because he sells Avon. Not at all. He just realized he could make more doing this online than he did selling the business cards that he used to sell. This is a way for John to supplement their Social Security disability income each month. Another highlight for me was the honor of being asked to preach at the Truth Matters Conference hosted by Grace to You and Dr. John MacArthur. 2019 marks the 50th year MacArthur has pastored Grace Community Church. I think the argument could be made that due to the sheer scope of his ministry, John MacArthur has done more to champion sound doctrine and expository preaching, equip pastors and churches than anyone since the apostolic era. He has stood for truth and has fought battles that very few were willing to fight. Some of his own friends in ministry just in the last couple of years have withered in the face of the prevailing cultural and theological winds leaving John to stand largely alone. But John knows that he will not one day answer to a board, committee, denomination or the public. He will one day answer to Christ. All of us, of course, will; it is just that for John, he actually seems to genuinely believe it and take it to heart.

I do not know John nearly as well as do many others. But I have been around him enough and know him well enough to confidently say he is a genuinely humble man. I have seen his humility on a couple of very unscripted occasions. No one is perfect (and he would be the first to tell you that), but I am profoundly grateful for John MacArthur. I have benefited more than words can express from his now over half-century of faithful ministry. He will finish his race well and will hear those blessed words, "Well done good and faithful slave...enter into the joy of your Master" (Matt. 25:23). I know he will hear those words, but I selfishly hope that he does not hear those words anytime soon.

## INTERNATIONAL

I had a robust international preaching schedule this year. My first trip was to Honduras where I taught a for-credit class on the Word-Faith/charismatic movement at MEDA seminary near the town of Siguatepeque. I taught there a few years ago and thoroughly enjoyed my visit. I'm always eager to accept invitations to teach young men in seminary because of the multiplier effect. If I can equip them then they, in turn, will equip the saints in their own churches.

I met a man named Porfirio. Porfirio is the son of one of Honduras's previous presidents. He was saved out of Roman Catholicism simply by reading the Bible. He began to realize that what he was reading in scripture did not square with what he was hearing from his priest. He asked the priest some of his questions but the priest just dismissed them and actually encouraged him *not* to study the Bible. Later, Porfirio and his wife got caught up in Word-Faith theology. They came across some of my teaching and, by God's grace, He used that to deliver them out of that deception as well. Porfirio is now a seminary student.

Another gentleman I met in Honduras was Carlos. Before his conversion, Carlos owned and operated three brothels – *three!* He, too, was converted by reading scripture. He became

convinced that he was a sinner and in desperate need of a Savior. God saved him and he immediately repented and tried to shut down his brothels (genuine repentance bears fruit). Sadly, his wife would have none of this because their "business" was a lucrative one. She divorced him and maintained the brothels. Carlos has been converted now for about a decade and is a faithful member of a doctrinally sound church in Honduras at which I preached. His pastor, Hernan Sierra, has become a good friend of mine and speaks very highly of Carlos. Following Christ cost Carlos everything.

In April I had the opportunity to preach in Ukraine. What a wonderful time I had there. It was a difficult country for me logistically because there are steps absolutely everywhere. There was even a step just to get into the airport after disembarking from my plane! The Ukrainians profusely apologized to me for this and explained that all the steps are remnants of their Soviet past. When Ukraine was part of the former Soviet Union, handicapped people were seen as burdens. If you didn't contribute to the collective, you were a burden to it and so handicapped people were either killed or put away in some horrific institution somewhere never to be seen again.

I preached at several churches as well as the main conference hosted by a seminary at which Phil Johnson and I both spoke (John MacArthur also spoke via satellite feed). One day at the main conference a man walked up to me and introduced himself as Mani.

Mani is originally from Iran but now lives in Ukraine. His profession is video editing and television. He said that he, too, was delivered out of charismatic deception through watching some of my teaching and had a great desire to disseminate it as widely as possible.

He said, "I have taken your videos and have been broadcasting them on television in Iran, Afghanistan and Tajikistan. I hope that is ok with you?" I was stunned. I said, "Are you asking if it is ok if you do this or are you already doing it?" He replied, "I am already doing it." Wow! Well of course it is ok! I could hardly believe it. These countries are quite hostile to the Gospel. I will likely never be able to go to them in person, but Mani is somehow getting the truth out anyway and it is being spread much further than what I would be able to accomplish even if I were able to go there in person. Praise the Lord!

In May, Andrew Rappaport and I went to the Philippines to preach at several churches and two main conferences, one in Manila and one in Cebu. Andrew heads Striving for Eternity Ministries and is an excellent evangelist and apologist. He has been a huge help to me in many ways.

I did my seminar, *Clouds Without Water*, and named not only many of the American false teachers but also some of the native Filipino ones as well. One of the prominent ones is named Joey Bonifacio. Bonifacio's son heard my comments and so started to blast Andrew and I on social

media for "parachuting in" from America and criticizing his dad and other (false) teachers. Everything I said about Bonifacio was true and documented so I was not concerned. We even offered to meet with Bonifacio, an offer that was declined. Bonifacio's comments created quite the dust-up which only served to raise the awareness of the conference. Many more tuned in who otherwise would not have.

By God's grace we continue to hear encouraging testimonies out of the Philippines from our time there. A great many people have written in saying that God used this to open their eyes to the deception they were in. Many said that as a result of the teaching they realized they were going to bad churches and have now sought out and joined sound ones. This is what the word of God does in the lives of believers. A genuine Christian may be in error – even significant error – for a season, but when he sees the truth from scripture, the Holy Spirit binds that truth to his conscience and the believer responds in obedience.

An unexpected trial (trials usually are unexpected) arose while in the Philippines. One day, all of the sudden, I lost use of my left arm. I could do a curling motion with it but could not press down at all nor could I feel the fingers on my left hand. Some of you may remember that two years ago I had my C4-C6 vertebrae fused due to bulging discs. These bulging discs rendered me unable to use my right arm. So, when my left arm suddenly stopped working, I thought, "Uh oh, here we go again." There were two doctors in the church at which I was preaching who hastily scheduled me for an MRI and did not charge me a dime for doing it – what a blessing! The results showed two more bulging discs: one immediately above and one below where the fusion surgery was performed two years ago. The MRI results were sent to the doctor in Idaho who performed my surgery. Once back stateside I went to see him and he said he would have to go back in and likely take out the hardware from two years ago and replace it with a larger piece of hardware so as to encapsulate the two additional bulging discs and accompanying vertebrae. Surgery was scheduled for August 8th.



With an arm that didn't work I could not travel and preach. So, I cleared my calendar from the remainder of May through mid-September so as to allow time for recuperation. One day, just about two weeks before surgery, I was sitting at the kitchen table and suddenly realized... *I can press down with my arm – and I can feel my fingers!* I called my surgeon and said, "I'm not real sure what to make of this but the strength has returned in my left arm and I can feel my fingers." He told me to come in for an evaluation. A few days later in his office, the surgeon gave me a few quick strength tests and saw that my strength had indeed returned. He said, "Well, as long as you do not have symptoms, there is no need for surgery." Needless to say, I didn't argue.

As of this writing in early 2020, I still have full strength in my arm, still have full feeling in my fingers and I still do not know what happened. As I see it, there are only two possibilities: (1) The offending disc moved a bit thereby relieving the pressure on the spinal cord or (2) God just healed me. Aside from having another MRI done which would tell the tale (and one was not ordered), I just don't know. I suppose time will tell. If the disc is still bulging but only moved a bit, then it will likely at some point move back and surgery will be needed again. Whatever the case, I am very grateful that I did not have to have surgery and could resume my preaching schedule. I am by no means ready to call this a miracle. So what is it? It is a kind and merciful providence of God for which I am truly grateful.

My final international trip for 2019 was to Zambia. I was invited by the Central Africa Baptist College and Seminary [www.cabuniversity.com](http://www.cabuniversity.com) to come and speak at their week-long conference. It was truly a wonderful time. There were over 500 in attendance; a significant number of which came from surrounding countries such as Zimbabwe, Tanzania, Mozambique, etc. I was told that over half in attendance (many of them pastors) were charismatic to one degree or another. I was actually quite happy to

hear this because it is nice to not always be preaching to the choir, so to speak.

I presented *Clouds Without Water* and, as I did in the Philippines, mentioned a number of native prosperity preachers such as Pastor Chris and David Oyedepo. Given that so many in attendance were charismatic, some of what I taught was a real challenge to them. They heard things that they had never heard before. They were certainly challenged but, to my knowledge, none got overly mad and all stayed through the entire week. I trust that the truth taught will have its decreed result in the hearts of those who heard it (Isaiah 55:11).



Mohammed belongs to Christ!

This is a man I met named Mohammed. Mohammed was born in Sudan and, as you can undoubtedly tell from his name, was definitely not reared in a Christian home. As a young man, someone gave Mohammed a New Testament. He began to read it and discovered that Jesus was not just a prophet but was indeed God the Son who gave His life as a ransom for many (Mark 10:45). The Holy Spirit convicted Mohammed of his sin and the truth of the Gospel - Mohammed got saved!

As you can imagine, his parents and entire family did not take his conversion well. He has basically been disowned by them. Mohammed knows what it means when Jesus said, "I did not come to bring peace but a sword. For I came to set a man against his father and a daughter against her mother...and a man's enemies will be members of his own household" (Matt. 10:34-36). Salvation is free, but discipleship is not. Mohammed may have lost his blood family upon his conversion, but he was adopted into a much larger and more intimate family, the family of God. He now has family all around the world (Matt. 12:47-50).

Also speaking at the conference was Dr. Conrad Mbewe, pastor of Kabwata Church in Lusaka, Zambia. Conrad was a speaker at the Strange Fire conference with me back in 2013 and we have spoken together at a few conferences since then, but I have never really had much one on one time with him until this trip. After the main conference, he and I drove the six hours to Lusaka together and he had me in his home where his sweet wife, Felistas, cooked us a fine meal.

For many years now I have had significant and chronic swelling in my feet and lower legs. I wear compression socks daily to keep the edema at least somewhat at bay. Normal socks I can get on and off by myself, but I could not do that with compression socks if my life depended on it. I asked Conrad if he could help me each night and morning to take off and put on, respectively, my compression socks. He graciously did so and even began to refer to the event as "our little ritual."

I have heard some disparage the so-called "evangelical elite." Some say that the big-name preachers (and Conrad would qualify) are just in it for the money and prestige. To be sure that is the case with some of them, but not all. I know some of the "evangelical elite," at least those in our soteriologically reformed circles. Some of them are friends of mine. And I can tell you that they are genuinely humble and faithful servants of Christ. Dr. Conrad Mbewe is one of them. John MacArthur is one. Paul Washer is another, just to name a few.

## CONTROVERSIES

Due to the nature of this ministry to which God has entrusted me, controversy does arise from time to time. I know it's hard to believe, but it does. You have likely heard that musician Kanye West made a profession of faith in Christ and now claims to be a born-again Christian. Wow, did this ever make the news! Every major news outlet reported this and evangelicals, with rare exception, were absolutely enthralled with this news and quickly jumped on the Kanye train. Well, I was one of those rare exceptions.

I put up a tweet not dismissive of Kanye's conversion, but urging caution with it. The blowback was furious. It was so ugly, in fact, that Kathy asked me to just get off of Twitter and so, out of respect for her, I did. In the weeks and months since, I think my caution has been proven to be more than warranted. Kanye has now told the world that it is ok to be a Roman Catholic, a Modalist (one who denies the trinity) like TD Jakes, and a Mormon. Kanye performed at Lakewood Church, pastored by Joel Osteen, one of the world's most prolific heretics. Not only did he perform there but he actually defended Joel Osteen against those, like me and many others, who have rightly criticized his false teaching. Kanye presumably still has the vast majority of those who followed him before his "conversion," and now millions more professing Christians who follow him. He is doing a great deal of harm.

The Apostle Paul says that an elder "must not be a new convert, so that he will not become conceited and fall into the condemnation incurred by the devil" (1 Tim. 3:6). Granted, we are not talking about Kanye West becoming an elder in a church, but the principle here nonetheless applies. At best - at the *very best* - Kanye is a new Christian and, therefore, should not be in a position of leadership in any capacity. He is partnering with and endorsing known heretics and undermining a great deal of discernment work that many other faithful men have been trying to do. That so many so quickly jumped onto this latest celebrity-turned-Christian bandwagon is most unfortunate.



The other big news was that Benny Hinn repented! Benny Hinn made a statement in early September 2019 that he no longer believed in the “gimmicks” of the prosperity gospel such as telling people to sow a specific monetary seed (such as \$1000) and expect a harvest of finances or health. This made big news. As with Kanye, there was widespread exuberance in the evangelical world but it, too, was premature.

Benny Hinn has not repented – not on any level. He may have backed away from some of the “gimmicks,” but he is still teaching the same thing he has always taught. He is still teaching Word-Faith theology, still claiming God speaks to him, still airing fake miracles and still telling people to give to his ministry and to expect blessings. He has only shied away from giving specific dollar amounts – that’s all. If Benny Hinn truly repented, there would be fruit in keeping with that repentance; Zaccheus type fruit (Luke 19). If Benny Hinn was truly repentant, he would publicly confess to the world that for the last 40+ years he has been lying about God speaking to him, lying about his finances and lying about all the so-called “miracles.” He would empty his ministry coffers and donate every cent to doctrinally sound ministries and churches. He would realize he is not biblically qualified to preach, shut his ministry down, join a sound church led by biblically qualified elders, sit in the pew and learn. The evidence Benny Hinn is truly repentant would not be if his preaching changes, it would be if his preaching *stops*. Then we would be getting somewhere.

One of the most telling indications that Benny Hinn has not repented is that in several interviews about his “repentance,” he said he taught the things he did because he had been manipulated by others into doing so. In a September 2019 interview, he even threw God under the bus. “Sometimes God takes a long time to wake us up. I don’t know why. Some day I think I’m going to ask Him,” stated Hinn. Benny Hinn is actually blaming *God* for his 40+ years of exploiting the poor, the sick, the desperate and the widows for personal financial gain. Space does not permit an exposition, but 2 Corinthians 7:10-11 gives us the most detailed description of what true repentance looks like. The Apostle Paul confronted the Corinthians in their sin and they were absolutely broken. They offered no excuses for their sin and did everything they could to make it right. That is true repentance. True repentance begins when we own our sin and make no excuses for it. The Corinthians did this and their relationship with the Apostle Paul and with Christ was beautifully restored.

## LOOKING AHEAD TO 2020

The book of James warns us not to confidently state what we will be doing in the future, but rather to say, “If the Lord wills...we will do this or that” (James 1:14-15). So, *if the Lord wills*, in 2020 I will be preaching all across the United States and also in Brazil, Columbia and possibly Ethiopia. I, Jim Osman, and Dave Cunningham, a pastor friend of mine in PA, will be leading a trip to Israel in November.

I have begun to add much more to my YouTube channel and will continue to do so. I have videos up on the Kanye West issue, Benny Hinn’s supposed repentance, my recent trip to Zambia, and even a prophetic word for 2020 (No, I haven’t gone wonky, promise). You can find my channel by searching Justin Peters Ministries. If you click the “Subscribe” button you will be notified anytime I add a new video. I will also be doing a podcast entitled *Didaché*. “Didaché” is the Greek word for doctrine. As the title implies, on this bi-weekly 30-minute podcast (you may subscribe at [strivingforeternity.org](http://strivingforeternity.org)) we will be discussing doctrine and theology. I will also interview special guests from time to time and answer questions sent in by listeners. I have some writing projects on my desk as well and so, Lord willing, it will be another busy and productive year.
